SWINGING BRIDGE RE-OPENS Former Friends of Baker Park Board Member Richard Lind Recognized



Joined by about 100 neighbors, civic leaders, Frederick city staff members, and elected officials, Mayor Randy McClement led a ribbon-cutting ceremony on June 19, 2012, to reopen Frederick's rebuilt Swinging Bridge. The *Frederick News-Post* noted that:

- The bridge was originally built in 1885
- Cables and rods were replaced in 1928
- It was condemned in 2001 and closed in 2002
- It is only iron suspension bridge in Frederick County

The Gazette reported that "repairs on the 100-foot bridge that spans Carroll Creek and connects Baker Park to Carroll

Parkway at the intersection of the parkway and North Jefferson Street were estimated at \$365,000 in 2008 when it was removed, so the city opted to do the work with in-house staff. The final project cost about \$190,000 — a little more than half of the estimate." The Gazette also noted, "Originally built in 1885, the bridge cost the city \$685 to build, according to information from the Maryland Archives website."

The Gazette also noted, "Marc Stachowski, Frederick's deputy director of public works, credited former mayor Jeff Holtzinger, who served from 2005 to 2009, with choosing to repair the broken-down bridge instead of removing it. The bridge was closed and torn down in 2008 because of structural issues, and work began on a new bridge, which has been built to match the original structure. The job included thousands of parts and welds, and uses a South American hardwood that's expected to last 50 years for the footpaths. When the bridge was removed completely in March 2008, the city expected to reopen it that summer. But work replicating the original parts took longer than expected, and a permit from the Maryland Department of the Environment took a year to obtain."

Former Friends of Baker Park Board Member Richard Lind was also cited for his technical leadership in the restoration of the bridge. According to the Gazette, "Richard Lind, a former engineer for the city who retired in 2004, . . . said he inspected the bridge at the time it closed, and made measurements of many of the pieces to help replace them. In recognition of his help, Stachowski gave him both a piece of the original bridge material and the new material as a keepsake."

"The Friends of Baker Park are delighted by this reopening," stated President Kathy Fay, who added, "Not only is this an important pedestrian walkway that connects the Parkway School and Carroll Creek neighborhood with the park, but it is also a historic structure and a significant resource to Baker Park and the City of Frederick." The Friends of Baker Park are working on a planting design for the bridge as well as discussing support for installation of signage about the bridge.

From the President

If you have been reading our newsletters you know that Friends of Baker Park has been actively involved in our newest and most ambitious project yet, the Culler Lake Renaissance, a renovation of the lake itself and the area of Baker Park surrounding it. For many months we have been presenting the conceptual plan to government officials and civic organizations and have met with enthusiasm as well as thoughtful suggestions that may be incorporated into the plan as we go forward. The master plan includes refurbishment of pathways, landscaping and fountain, and construction of a pavilion and ice skating feature, while preserving the natural environment.

Our first order of business, however, is construction of a storm water mitigation system to permanently clean up the water. Culler Lake has been a de facto storm water management pond since it was built as part of a public works project in the 1930s. This means that storm drains from the 66 acres north of the lake have been dumping directly into it and thus into Carroll Creek, the Monocacy River, and the Chesapeake Bay. The water has not been cleaned since the mid-1980s and its quality will only continue to deteriorate if a permanent solution is not implemented.

We just submitted a grant application to the Chesapeake Bay Trust for funds to create an engineering plan for a storm water mitigation system. Representatives of the Trust met with us at the lake and were very encouraging so we have every hope that our application will be looked on favorably. In preparing the application we were fortunate to have the expertise of Matt Trendell of Morgan Keller, Zack Kershner of Frederick City Engineering Department, and Shannon Moore of the Frederick county Office of Sustainability & Environmental Resources, all of whom gave us invaluable time and technical advice.

We provided the Trust with letters of support for the project from Frederick Mayor Randy McClement, Director of Parks and Recreation Roelkey Myers, County Manager of the Office of Sustainability and Environmental Resources Shannon Moore, and Friends' groups both upstream and downstream from Culler Lake, Friends of Carroll Creek and Friends of Waterford Park.

So keep fingers crossed - I hope to be able to report good news in our next newsletter! If you would like us to present the master plan for the lake to your group, please contact me at 301-694-9686.
