



Project History

- 2001 Mayor and Board of Aldermen adopt City-wide Shared Use Path Plan
 - Included this very important link
- 2007 Funding was put into the CIP for design and construction of the linking of Waterford and Baker Park
- 2008 Project reached final approval, but due to unforeseen economic conditions was canceled
- 2012 Applied for and received Bikeways Grant for Design and Construction Management
- 2012 Funding for construction approved in the CIP
- 2013 McLaren Engineering was selected as the design firm and construction manager
- 2014 Design work continues, we are now at about 75% complete

SCOPE OF SERVICES REQUESTED

• The work to be done under this contract includes:


Engineering, surveying, preparing and submitting plans and specifications for approval by the City, applying for a building, electrical and plumbing permits, providing all contract documents to bidders and contractors, providing digital files in AutoCAD in accordance with the City of Frederick Standard Design and Construction Specifications, as well as furnishing all labor, materials, tools, equipment, superintendence, transportation, and performing all work in strict accordance with the Request for Proposal.

SCOPE OF SERVICES REQUESTED

- The work to be done under this contract shall also include:
 - Scheduling and attending pre- design meetings with the City Of Frederick's Engineering and Department of Public Works staff to review operational concerns and to review the scope of work needed, assessment of existing conceptual plans, preparation of construction plans and documents, preparation of a report with preliminary cost estimates; presentation of construction plans and estimates to Department of Public Works and Engineering Department staff for owners approval, preparation of sealed detailed plans and specifications for bidding, assistance with the advertising for bids, attending the pre-bid conference, evaluating bids and making a recommendation to the Mayor and Board of Aldermen.

- Low / no maintenance railings of recycled materials
- All native species for landscape restorations




US15 Undercrossing
